HOCHTIEF Construction rejects prosecutor's allegations

Experts disprove allegations - Confident lookout on further development

HOCHTIEF Construction rejects allegations made by the public prosecutor in Munich: The prosecutor's office accuses the company of having indirectly accepted that one of the subcontractors paid illegal dumping wages on a construction site in Munich which has been completed in the meantime. "We have been denying the prosecutor's allegations for years now. We have delivered the facts in this matter, and in addition, these facts have been checked by independent experts. Therefore, we are confident about the further course of the proceedings", says Henner Mahlstedt, CEO of HOCHTIEF Construction.

The company assumes that it can continue to participate in bid invitations in Bavaria despite the current proceedings. This is because HOCHTIEF Construction is convinced that it has not committed any misdemeanors. HOCHTIEF has issued clear directives and put into place exemplary initiatives in the construction industry: The Group was one of the first construction companies worldwide, for example, to have concluded a Social Charta with the International Labour Organization ILO.

"We will continue to disclose all facts in the course of the proceedings. However, we will in no case carry out the legal dispute with all its details via the media", Mahlstedt underlines.
